


The Hight Family & Timothy and Rosie

Bogey & Bacall

Were born in April 2004. The stray kittens were rescued in August 2004 from under a porch. The home owner had dogs that were not cat friendly. Only 2 kittens were rescued by a neighbor. It's unknown what happend to the mother or any litter mates.

ARF took the kittens to the vet for their first round of shots and to be spayed & neutered. No medical problems were found. On their second vet visit they received another round of vaccines. Bogey had an allergic reaction and was passed out in the countainer when he arrived back at ARF. He was rushed back to the vets and was revived. At that time ARF was told he could never have further vaccines. He was put on an everyday pill to keep him from catching colds, etc. Dec 2005 they were adopted together as indoor cats only. The wife passed away in 2015 and the husband continued to care for the cats. Unknown to ARF, when he remarried his new wife insisted the cats be declawed and put outside. The husband passed away and apparently Bogey began to no longer recieve his daily medication. The housekeeper came and begged ARF to rescue the cats.



So, July 2015 Bogey & Bacall returned to ARF. We found that Bogey could hardly breath. He had an upper respitory infection and a urinary tract infection. After visiting multiple vets and going to a specialist in Tulsa he sadly did not recover and passed away.


Bacall is now 12 years old and still lives at ARF. She loves to be held and would enjoy a new indoor only home.



Star was born in 1998. Thru no fault of his own, Star has had a very traumatic life. When he was 5 years old he lost the only home he had known. His owner became ill and had to move in with her son. Her son did not allow pets. His elderly owner came in to ARF understandably very upset and worried about what would happen to Star. ARF took him in and promised we would find him a good home.

Because he had originally lived with an older lady we thought that his new adopter would be a perfect match. However, he was returned to ARF 8 years later when his owner developed medical issues and could no longer care for Star.

Shortly after returning to ARF we discovered that Star had cancer in his right eye. He ended up having to have that eye removed. A year later he developed an unrelated cancer that started on his nose. Thru time it spread to his abdomen. He lived the remainder of his life with us at ARF.

This spring ARF took in 3 Momma cats. The Sanctuary was soon home to 15 new kittens plus our normal cat population. Even though each family of cats was isolated in a separate room. Kitten ailments started to show up. Vet bills began to rise as runny

eyes, internal parasites, diarrhea, and ring worms all ran their courses. Sadly 2 of the kittens did not survive. We have recently taken in 2 more stray kittens which brings our total back to 15 kittens. All of these past medical bills and future costs of their spay/neuters is putting undo stress on our monthly expenses. So think of this as a kitten shower and come to our rescue by donating to help cover these medical costs.
