8 MOST DANGEROUS PLANTS

Many common plants, both in the house and in the yard, can be toxic to our pets. Some plants only cause mild stomach upset, while others can be poisonous. And, some plants are safe for some species while deadly for others.

Rhodondendrons, azaleas, laurels and Japanese pieris are highly toxic to all species and deserve extra caution.

Sago palms can cause liver failure and death in dogs and cats. All parts of the plant are toxic, with the seeds having the highest concentration of toxin. One seed can kill a dog within 24 hours.


Oleander, foxglove and lily of the valley can slow the heartbeat and even stop it. These plants are toxic to all species. Japanese yew contains compounds that have a direct effect on the heart. The toxins can cause an irregular heartbeat or even stop the heart. All parts, except for the bright red berry, are toxic. Sudden death can result within hours of ingestion.

Castor beans contain ricin, which can be highly toxic. Ricin causes multiple organ failure. Ricin is found throughout the plant, but the highest level is found in the seeds. The seed coat must be damaged to release the toxins, so animals who swallow the seed whole may not get sick.

Autumn crocus contains chemotherapy-like compounds that attack rapidly dividing cells in the body. Ingestion can cause vomiting, diarrhea, weakness and possible death. Spring crocus is not toxic. Hops are used in beer brewing. Ingestion of hops by dogs causes their body temperature to skyrocket. Signs can be seen within hours. Dogs become agitated and begin to pant. Their body temperature can get high enough to kill them.

Lilies: Easter lilies, tiger lilies ruburm or Japanese showy lilies and day lilies have been shown to cause kidney failure in cats. Even a few nibbles can cause kidney failure. Cats often vomit within a few hours and stop producing urine within 72 hours.


LOVE-A-PET WEEK



The ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center operates a hotline 24 hours a day, seven days a week at 888-426-4435 for a fee of \$45 per case. If you call, you should be prepared to provide the following information: name of the poison your animal was exposed to, the amount and how long ago; the species, breed, age, sex, and weight of your pet; and the symptoms the animal is displaying. You'll also be asked to provide your name, address phone number and credit card information.



And, please do not leave cans at our site on Hwy 60. We are not set up for collection there. Please bring them to 127 NE Washington behind our building.






Aluminum Cans
